- Complete **Laboratory and Classroom Safety Contract**. BOTH student and parent/guardian must read and sign this form.
- Parent/guardian must register the student either in person at the Alaska Law Enforcement Museum, or by mail (see mailing address below). You may register and pay for camp with cash, check, or by phone or in person with a credit card. We must have the completed Camp Application returned to the Alaska Law Enforcement Museum in order to accept the tuition payment which completes the student registration. RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Camp Location:

Alaska Law Enforcement Museum 245 W 5th Ave. STE 112 Anchorage. AK. 99501

2. Hours:

Tues Registration: 8:30-9:00 a.m. CAMP starts: 9:00 a.m. CAMP ends: 3:30 p.m.

3. Arrivals and Departures:

The pickup and drop off area of the camp is at the main entrance of the Museum. Camp monitors will be at the class from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. each day.

4. Personal Belongings:

Personal belongings are the camper's responsibility. FOAST will not be responsible for lost or stolen items. Games and other personal belongings from home are not needed and are discouraged. Games, guns, knives, and other such items are not allowed.

5. Meals:

The camp fee includes a lunch. There will be no refunds or options on the lunch menu. The camp plans to feed students with Costco Pizza, sandwiches, Hamburg's and Hot dogs. Students may bring a bag lunch if these meals present an issue.

6. Field Trip:

The campers will participate in a field trip on Friday May 26th to The Department of Fish and Game Shooting Range located on Rabbit Creek Road off the Seward Highway- Parents need to drop students off at 9:00 am and pick-up at 3:00pm.

7. Emergency Care Provisions:

The camp administrator will discuss emergency evacuation procedures on the first day of camp. The camp instructors are trained in first aid.

8. Illness and Accidents:

In the event of a serious accident the person listed as the contact will be called immediately, as well as the paramedics.

9. Discipline:

Attendees are expected to have respectful, mature and well-mannered behavior. Students will be sent home if they cannot comply with camp guidelines.

10. Animals and Pets:

No animals are allowed on the premises.

11. Smoking:

No smoking is allowed.

12. Insurance:

FOAST maintains liability insurance to cover the camp.
